The Parents of the Graduating Class of 2010:

It is hard to believe but the time has come to prepare for the end of the year graduating activities.

In order to make sure these events go smoothly, remember to send in the required paper work and or payments. Here is a list of the important dates and requirements:

1. Trip to Club Getaway, CT: Thursday, May 27th. Permission Slip due by Friday, May 14th.
2. Yearbook: 2010. The students will receive their book of Memories on Tuesday, June 15. The discounted cost of the yearbook is \$85 (original price \$125). All books must be pre-paid by Wednesday, May 26th for the students to receive their copy. Unfortunately the school cannot absorb the price of the yearbooks without advance payment. Thus, this rule will be strictly enforced! Please submit the check for the yearbook to the homeroom teacher by Wednesday, May 26th.
3. Communion Breakfast: Thursday, June 17th. It is necessary to make reservations to attend the Graduation Liturgy and Breakfast so as to have proper church seating and refreshments prepared in advance. ALL reservations are due by Wednesday, May 26th. Parents of the graduates and the Graduates are guests of the Class of 2010! Please enclose a check of \$10 per person for all other guests you wish to attend this special day. The students are to bring their gowns neatly ironed and wear them for the liturgical service. **NO CAPS.** The Graduates are allowed to go home after the morning brunch to prepare for their graduation social in the evening!
4. Graduation Social: Thursday, June 17th. This social is a dress up event and is a gift to the graduates!

Proper attire is required. The gentlemen must wear dress slacks, shirt and jacket. The young ladies must wear an appropriate lady-like dress. Halter-tops or flimsy outfits and short dressy skirts are unacceptable attire for the evening! **No exceptions – if in doubt, then it is inappropriate for school.** A permission slip is needed to attend the social.
