- **H1N1 Vaccine**

This past week I received a notice from the Office of the Superintendent of Schools in the Archdiocese of New York notifying me that the anticipated date that H1N1 vaccinations will begin is **approximately November 9, 2009.**

This morning the school received some consent forms. I have been in contact with the Superintendent's office and the Department of Health to inquire about receiving the remainder of the forms I had requested. Since the number of consent forms I have received to date is clearly not enough to cover the entire school population, today I am sending home consent forms only to the Kindergarten. When I receive the remaining consent forms, they will be sent home immediately with the following steps you will need to take:

Kindergarten Parents - listed below are the steps you must follow regarding the H1N1 consent form.

1. All forms must be returned no later than **9:00 a.m. Monday, November 2. No EXCEPTIONS will be made. I am required to follow the mandated deadline of the Archdiocese of New York and the Department of Health.**
2. The consent form must be returned in the envelope you received with the consent form.
3. Your child's name and grade must be written on the consent form.
4. The form must be completed legibly.
5. Once the school receives the consent form, you will be contacted by The School via phone call to confirm your consent of your child receiving H1N1.
6. Clearly state on the form if your child has any type of allergies. It is essential that such information be included on the consent form for the safety of your child in administering the vaccine.

As the vaccination day draws near, I remind you again that, at this point, the date is an approximation; I will contact you with the time each grade will be vaccinated and the procedure for the day.

I ask that you be in contact with your pediatrician with regards to your child receiving the vaccine. Several of you have asked me what I feel you should do with respect to vaccinating your child. In truth, that is a conversation between you and your child's doctor.

Again, when I receive the remaining consent forms, I will immediately send them home to students in Grades 1 -8.

- **Safe Environment Program**

Attention Parents/Guardians:

This is to inform you that the Archdiocese's mandated Safe Environment Program for Sexual Abuse Awareness will be part of your children's religion classes again this year. The goal of the program is to affirm the dignity of the human person as created in the image and likeness of God. We know that ministry with children is a sacred trust. We, at Saint Ignatius Loyola School, are committed to preserve, at all times and in all places, this sacred trust which is rooted in our faith in Jesus Christ.

In 2002, the United States Bishops approved The Charter for Protection of Children and Young People. Article 12 of this charter directs all dioceses to create programs and processes to teach children and youth about sexual abuse and its prevention. In the Archdiocese of New York, this will be integrated into the religious education program in all grades.

For your information and review, a copy of the Safe Environment Curriculum from K-8 is available at the main office. If you have any questions, please contact Ms. Larkin at extension 130.
